From the Archery Captain & Thrown Weapons Marshal

Archers to the Line! Per Society and kingdom, we can continue official target archery and thrown weapons practices, in accordance with local restrictions, through the end of May 31, 2021. As archery captain and the thrown weapons group marshal, I require all participants to wear masks or face covering, and to maintain social distancing on the range.

We had a banner archery practice on December 13th. For most, if not all, of us, it was the first time any of us shot with snow on the ground (about 2 inches). More importantly, we had FIVE new archers, Tanja and her daughter Katie, and Brad, Victoria, and their daughter Katje. Thank you, Baron Abelard, for introducing Brad and his family to us.

Thrown weapons practice is on hold until spring. Archery Practice will increasingly be subject to weather as we journey further into winter. COVID conditions may also force cancellation of practice.

The Saturday archery practices will be scheduled for January 2nd, January 16th, and January 30th at 10 am at Kinnickinnic River Parkway (2050 W Kinnickinnic River Pkwy, Milwaukee, WI 53215).

Archery Practice will be scheduled for Sunday January 10th and January 24th at 10 am at Menomonee Park (W220 N7884 Town Line Rd, Menomonee Falls- \$5/car entrance fee).

With the passing earlier this year of Baron Nigel FitzMaurice de Caer Anor, the creator and maintainer of the Gwyntarian Winter Shoot, which the archers of Caer Antherth Mawr have shoot in for over 20 years, the annual winter shoot we (Continued on page 4)

Announcements from the Society

Resolution to Suspend In-Person SCA Activity Updated – December 4, 2020

Greetings:

At the end of July, the Board of Directors issued a proclamation suspending most inperson SCA activities in North America until January 31, 2021, due to the COVID-19 global pandemic. In November, we asked the Kingdom Seneschals and Crowns of the known world to give us their counsel on how to proceed in the first part of 2021. We received very thoughtful responses from nearly all Crowns and Kingdom Seneschals as well as many other concerned people. We wish to thank everyone who responded for taking the time to do so, and for putting such effort into your responses.

After reading and discussing the feedback received, the Board decided at their conference call meeting on 12/01/2020 to continue the suspension of in-person activities in North America through May 31, 2021. That action reads as follows:

Motion by Ross Roegner to extend the Resolution to Suspend In-Person SCA Activity until January 31, 2021, originally issued by the Board of Directors on July 28, 2020, for a period of four (4) months, until May 31, 2021.

Second by Gigi Coulson. Opposed: none. Absent: Jennifer Krochmal. Motion carried.

While there is good news on the horizon regarding effective vaccines and other ways to treat and manage COVID, implementation of those treatments is still in the future. The current situation shows that infection rates are continuing to increase in many places throughout North America. The most important concern at this time must be the safety of all participants.

Please remember that federal, state, provincial, and local health directives and guidelines must continue to be followed whenever Kingdoms decide to authorize smaller local inperson meetings and local fighter practices. These local activities remain under the discretion of the Crown and Kingdom Seneschal. Kingdom Earl Marshals are welcome to give advice to the Crowns and Kingdom Seneschals when approving local practices.

Virtual events, as have been happening in many kingdoms, are of course allowed and encouraged to continue. If a Kingdom believes that the circumstances in their area allow for an in-person event, beyond approved local practices and meetings, to be held safely before May 31, 2021, the Crown and Kingdom Seneschal are welcome to discuss a variance with the Society Seneschal.

Such variances for events beyond local practices and meetings will be considered, but please keep in mind that limits on participants, mask requirements, local government approval, insurance questions, vaccine availability, and actual conditions regarding the epidemic in the Kingdom requesting the variance are all important issues that will be considered and discussed for any requested variances prior to the May 31, 2021 date.

Further, as stated in the original Resolution, if a Crown or Coronet feels the need to step down without heirs, a regent may be installed according to the laws of the kingdom or principality. If those laws are not adequate for the situation, the kingdom is invited to work with the Society Seneschal to create a solution that will be in the best interests of the kingdom or principality.

Live events and personal interactions are a large part of the way the Society has continued over the last fifty-plus years. These restrictions on live events in the SCA are painful, but the state of the world, and the well-being of everyone involved, currently require we be as careful as possible.

It does look like there will be vaccines available soon and once the epidemic is under some semblance of control, we can have live events again and celebrate all our interests and community safely.

Da'ud Bob's Movie Review for December 2020

I'd seen a preview for this foreign film a little while back, and decided then and there that I really needed to see it. And to review it for you, my loyal readers, too, of course! So in spite of all the theaters being pretty much closed down, I kept my eyes peeled for it. And, of course, never saw it. Finally, finally, I found that it would be released on DVD and Blu-Ray at the end of September 2020. So I bided my time, waiting patiently (patiently, I say!) for the right time and then pre-ordered it. And then waited patiently (patiently, I say!) for it to arrive at my doorstep. Finally, after waiting days (nay, months! Years, even!) it arrived, and I was able to put it in the tray of the video player, plop myself down in my big ol' La-Z-Bubba recliner, and hit "Play". And so it is that this month, Da'ud Bob reviews for you a Kazakh film of one of that region's early heroines, a warrior and leader and slayer of Achaemenids, in *The Legend of Tomiris*.

Starring Almira Tursyn in the title role, Adil Akhmetov as Argun, Erkebulan Dairov as Harasp, Berik Aytzhanov as Kurtun, Satybaldy Azamat as Kavaz, Aizhan Lighg as Sardana, Ghassan Massoud as Cyrus (in truth, Cyrus II, or Cyrus the Great), Yerden Telemisov as the Akibat leader, and Zarina Totaeva as Tana, this movie presents one version of the life of the queen of the Massagetae, an Iranian people from Scythian pastoral-nomadic confederation of Central Asia east of the Caspian Sea, Tomiris (also often found as Tomyris, Thomyris, Tomris, Tomiride, or Queen Tomiri). As one synopsis put it, "This is the story of the life of the great queen of the steppe -- legendary Tomiris. She is destined to become a skillful warrior, survive the loss of close people and unite the Scythian/Saka tribes under her authority." Is it an accurate history? Well, no. The earliest stories we have of her life come from Herodotus, who was writing a full century after she lived. The film version even has her story being passed down through the writings of the 10th Century Arab Abu Nasr al-Farabi, who translated a number of Greek texts into Arabic, thus preserving many of them for us today. And, for example, there seem to be at least five different narratives of how Cyrus met his death, including one which says that he died peaceably at his capital; this movie more closely follows the version found in Herodotus.

Good points: The cinematography. The compound bows. The scenery! (Filming took place at several picturesque locales throughout Kazakhstan, including Zharkent, Chunzha, Borovoye, and Bayan.) Sardana's dismount. No stirrups! (They were a much later invention.) The lion gate of Babylon. The Scythian deer ring. The leather flask. Target practice from horseback. The fight choreography.

Bad points: The language (the movie was subtitled in English) is not modern Kazakh or Russian, and ended up sounding a bit like a mix of Klingon and Vulcan. Would she really have changed the death and burial ritual of her people?

Two breasts. Two gallons of blood. 194 dead bodies. Sword fu. Lance fu. Arrow fu. Dagger fu. Horn fu. War hammer fu. Battle axe fu. Hand rolls. Fighters roll. Head rolls. Gratuitous skulls. Gratuitous waterfall. Gratuitous politics. Gratuitous drawbridge. Gratuitous self-immolation. Gratuitous (CGI) fiery winged lion monster. Gratuitous bath. Gratuitous carp fishing. Gratuitous hawk eating its dinner. Gratuitous dancing girls. Gratuitous camels. Gratuitous tiger. Gratuitous fire breather. Academy Award nomination to Almira Tursyn as Tomiris for "Watch out for this Persian. He talks too much." A 92 on the Vomit Meter. (Well, it does have a pretty high body count.) 3½ stars. Da'ud Bob says, "If it's spot-on accurate history you're looking for, you probably need to stop watching historical movies, because they always mess up the history. On the other hand, if you like a good movie about a historical figure that gives you a real feel for the life and times of that person, you should check this one out!"

2020 In Review

The year 2020 has been a year like no other in the in the history of the Society. It will be remembered as “*Anno Plaga*”, the Year of the Plague, when the SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) virus effectively shut down most in-person activities, both within the Society and the wider modern world, starting in mid-March. The racial crisis came to the forefront in the summer, in the wake of several high profile police shootings and the increasingly obvious socio-economic inequalities people of color experience in the modern world. The Society also took steps to address similar issues within the organization, principally through its new Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Office.

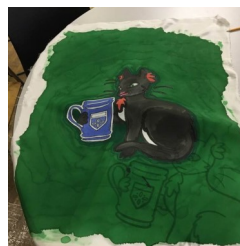
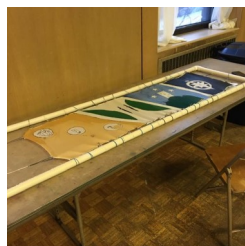
While COVID-19, did shut all in-person events, and many in-person activities, it did not shut down the SCA in total. Mercifully, the pandemic struck during the Internet Age, permitting the emergence of the “e-SCA”. People were able to connect online through various meeting platforms (oh, to have bought stock in Zoom last year...), online classes and symposium events proliferated, and the crowns and coronets of the Known World began to hold virtual courts, “Ethereal Courts” in the case of Their Majesties Northshield.

Caer Anterth Mawr was not immune to the affects of the pandemic. Surprisingly, a number of activities still happened within the barony. A number of people made masks for healthcare workers and others. Lady Belle de la Tour began hosting monthly online social gatherings. Curia began meeting online, with generally larger turnouts than in-person curia meetings typically did. And despite the virus, we still found ways to meet in person.

January 18– Yule Court- Their Excellencies held their first full baronial court. The registered names for the Order of the Castle's Commanders, the Order of the Mullet of Caer Anterth Mawr, Award of the Millstone of Caer Anterth Mawr, and Award of the Tower Rising were read into quote. The Orders/Awards of the Flaming Heart and Whistling Swan were closed. The Award of the Flame and Swan, for arts & sciences, was established, with the registered badge, (Fieldless) *On a flame Or a swan naiant azure* . Lady Joharra was made its premiere recipient.



February 1– Silk Banner Making Moot– Lord Akos moot steward– About 20 people gathered at Redeemer Lutheran Church for designing and making silk banners.



March 12– The Kingdom Stallari Council cancels all in-person events, meetings, practices, and gatherings, originally through March 31st. It was later extended to June 30th, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and governmental recommendations.

July 1– Kingdom permits limited in-person activities, including archery, thrown weapons, & equestrian practices, and small A&S and business meetings. Contact arts martial, such as armored combat, rapier, and youth combat are still prohibited.

July 29– The SCA Board of Directors suspends all in-person events in North America through January 31, 2021. Local activities that were permitted by kingdom are still permitted.

September 26– First ever virtual baronial court is held.

September– St. James Episcopal Church, Caer Anterth's early home and site of many Boar's Heads, re-opened as an event venue.

October 24– Viking Hiking about 12-15 people gathered at Retzer Nature Center for a masked, socially distanced Viking Hiking.



December 5–The SCA Board of Directors extends its suspension on in-person events through May, 31, 2021

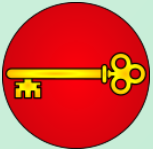
