Archery Captain and Thrown Weapons Marshal

Archers and Throwers to the Line! Per Society and kingdom, we can continue official target archery and thrown weapons practices, in accordance with local restrictions, through the end of January 2021. As archery captain and the thrown weapons group marshal, I **require all participants to wear masks or face covering, and to maintain social distancing on the range.**

October 24th, in the spirit of Halloween, we held a Jack O' Lantern novelty shoot. A large pumpkin was drawn on the back of a standard 60 cm target. The face of the pumpkin was 1 point, the mouth was worth 3 points, and the eyes and nose were worth 5 points. Because one should not pick-up a pumpkin by the stem, the stem was worth -5. After 13 rounds of six arrows, the scores were:

Arnbjörn Karlsson: 137

William of Mann: 112

Rhys ap Ishmæl Llygad Odd: 110

Abelard die Elster: 13 (who unfortunately hit the stem a few times)

As winter approaches, we will start playing by ear the scheduling for archery and TW practices. We will continue to alternate Saturday-Sunday morning outdoor practices in November, weather permitting.

Archery Practice will be on Saturday November 8th and November 22nd at 10 am at Kinnickinnic River Parkway (2050 W Kinnickinnic River Pkwy, Milwaukee, WI 53215). Thrown Weapons Practice will be held at 12:00 pm. November 22nd will be the last planned thrown weapons practice until probably April.

Archery Practice will be on Sunday November 1st, November 15th, and November 29th at 10 am at Menomonee Park (W220 N7884 Town Line Rd, Menomonee Falls- \$5/car entrance fee).

If anyone is interested becoming an archery marshal-in-training and/or thrown weapons marshal-in-training, please let me know. William, Rhys, and I are all training marshals for archery, and I may become one for thrown weapons, once I complete the MiT process myself, hopefully next year.

Baron and Baroness: We had a court, and will distribute the awards. We can't do much in person, but can do Viking Hiking, archery, and thrown weapons. There are various online activities for folks who are interested, and join us for the online social gatherings.

Seneschal: Working on these new technologies, like this Google Meet. (Same meeting details for every Curia). If you have any questions, problems, or complaints please let Randall know. (Tatiana and Sofonisba had issues connecting from the facebook link on ipads.)

Chronicler: Reports due by the 25th - will take them to the end of

the day Sunday unless someone requests more time. If you're interested in helping out with November & December please let her know via email or Facebook.

Webminister: Not much to report - haven't really done anything. There's still an issue with error messages tied to google groups (for the coronet email) - the email goes through but we don't know why. Some changes happening with google groups which might affect the mailing lists in general - sent email to Sofonisba, who manages the mailing list.

Minister of Arts and Sciences: It was a discombobulated month. Animal husbandry! Textile work! Garb work! Cooking! Tasting history! Calligraphy! Scrolls! Kudos to the signet for organizing the scrolls! Soldering blue juice! This is the month when we need to figure out who will be the new MOAS.

Knights Marshal: Got a response back from the KEM - we can have practices in which we can do footwork drills or pell work, but can't do live action fighting. Will put out a request via the newsletter to see if there's enough interest in starting one of those practices, either at the church or elsewhere. Virtual fighter symposium online on Nov 21.

Rapier: People are using online resources. Do that!

Youth: Will resume when practices resume. If any youth fighters want suggestions about what to do when you can't fight anyone, or gear, or pell work, or drills, let Abelard know.

Archery/TW: We can do things! We've been having practices, alternating Saturdays and Sundays. This weekend (Oct 24th) we'll have archery at 10, thrown weapons at noon. When we reach November we'll play weekend practices by ear.

Chatelaine: Had a new person contact me this month! Baronial social will be November 5, starting at 7. Will send out the link via facebook; someone else will send it to the mailing list.

Exchequer: Nothing much has changed. Got the quarterly reports to the regional. Still running a deficit for the fighter fund. We have an outstanding check which we'll probably void.

Scottish Trivia

- The Scotti, a Gaelic speaking tribe, are believed to originate from what is now County Antrim, Northern Ireland. They establish the Kingdom of Dal Riata in the southwest of Scotland, in the fifth century, around the same time of the Anglo-Saxon invasions in southern Britain. In the late ninth century, Dal Riata and Pictland merged into the Kingdom of Alba (Scotland).
- “Brave heart” was a honorific given to Robert the Bruce, not William Wallace. His heart was taken on crusade to Spain against the Moors, before it was interred at Melrose Abbey.
- The Orkney and Shetland Isles were part of the Kingdom of Norway until 1470, when they were forfeited as payment for the dowry of Margaret, the daughter the Norwegian king, to James III, King of Scots.
- The Kingdom of Scotland (843 CE) was established before the Kingdom of England (927 CE).
- Saint Andrew is the Patron Saint of Scotland, as well as Barbados, Romania, Russia, Ukraine, Sarzana, and Prussia. His feast day is November 30th.
- The national animal of Scotland is the unicorn, not Nessie.
- The national motto of Scotland is *Nemo me impune lacessit* (No one provokes me with impunity)
- The Royal House of Stewart (the French spelling *Stuart* was adopted by Mary, Queen of Scots) was established by Robert II. His parents were Marjorie Bruce, the daughter of Robert I (Robert the Bruce), and Walter Stewart, the 6th High Steward of Scotland.
- The game of curling was created in Scotland. The oldest known curling stone is inscribed with the date “1511.” The modern game of golf was also established in Scotland at least by the 15th century, when James II banned golf in 1457, because it was a distraction from archery practice.

- Haggis is not a Scottish animal. It is a traditional Scottish dish that includes sheep heart, lungs, and liver. ‘nuff said.
- There is a sport in Scotland called “haggis hurling.” The current record of hurling haggis is 217 feet. (Personally, I think this would be a great addition to the Border Skirmish activities.)
- At a competitive haggis eating competition, the winning competitor ate 3 pounds of haggis in 8 minutes.
- More haggis is sold in England than Scotland. (Thank goodness, because I’d always thought of Scots as eminently sensible.)
- Haggis was probably not invented by Scots. Romans and Greeks had very similar dishes. (Repeat personal comment from previous point.)

Recipes

Since it's Fall and the last of the harvest is coming in, I thought a recipe for squash soup would be nice.

GOURDES IN POTAGE. VIII.

Take young Gowrdes pare hem and kerue [1] hem on pecys. cast hem in gode broth, and do þer to a gode pertye [2] of Oynouns mynced. take Pork soden. grynd it and alye it þer with and wiþ zolkes of ayrenn. do þer to safroun and salt, and messe it forth with powdour douce.

Modern version - squash soup - take calabash gourd (or butternut, acorn squash, you could even add some yams - whatever you have - finding European varieties is harder than you think) pare them and cut into pieces, cook in good broth with minced onion. (add salt to taste) You could also roast the gourd/squash in the oven with a little salt and olive oil - YUM - then add it to some chicken broth and minced onion to finish cooking. Not too much broth or the soup will be too thin. Just enough to cover it. Cook until the squash is soft when you poke it. This is the point where I would usually use an immersion blender on the boiled squash and onion. But you do you.

Next step - Take boiled pork and grind it up and mix with egg yolks and add to the pot with saffron, salt, and powder douce. -now, this doesn't sound particularly appetizing to me, so I would make some little pork meatballs with ground pork, eggs, some breadcrumbs, salt, saffron, and powder douce. This sounds a lot like the little Spanish saffron meatballs we've had before at a Missy feast. You could boil them in the soup, but I would bake them in the oven abd drop them into my blended soup with a little parsley or powder douce garnish.

Anyone who knows a Scot knows their bowels are of particular interest. The Scots swear by their morning parritch to keep them regular.

GREWEL OF ALMAUNDES. XX.III. VI.

Take Almaundes blaunched, bray hem with oot meel [1]. and draw hem up with water. cast þeron Safroun & salt &c.

[1] oot meel. oat-meal.

Grind blanched almonds with oatmeal, cook in water. Add saffron, salt, etc.

Steel cut oats are going to give you a more authentic chew than rolled oats. Follow the directions on the steel cut oats package, add some almond flour for flavor, taste, and added protein. This is medieval cook-erey, so you get to decide how much or how little. When it's done to your liking add salt, saffron if you have it, or whatever you have around. I like fresh berries, apples, cinnamon, butter, brown sugar, etc. Your choices are endless, but a classic bowl of morning porridge is very plain.

Macbeth mac Findlaech

William Shakespeare's play, *Macbeth*, tells the tale of a Scottish lord who, at the bidding of his ambitious wife, kills Duncan, the King of Scotland, by "murder most foul", and claims the Scottish crown. Duncan's son later kills Macbeth. What many people do not realize is that there was a real King Macbeth, although he was not the villain Shakespeare made him.

Mac Bethad (Macbeth) mac Findlaích was born in 1005. His father was Findláech mac Ruaidrí, Mormar (lord or king) of Moray. His grandfather may have been Malcom II, King of Scots. Findláech was killed in 1020 in a tribal conflict and Malcom took in Macbeth. Malcolm II died in 1034 and was succeeded by his grandson, Duncan, who was already King of Strathclyde.

Unlike the wise old man on the play, the historical King Duncan was young and undisciplined. He led a series of unsuccessful campaigns into northern England. After suffering a major defeat in Northumbria, Duncan faced a revolt at home, led by his cousin Macbeth. In the play, Macbeth murders Duncan as he slept in his bed. In reality, Macbeth killed Duncan in battle, near Elgin in 1040.

Both Macbeth and his wife (and cousin), Gruoch, had a stronger claim to the Scottish crown than Duncan, by virtue of being more direct decedents of Kenneth Mac Alpin, the first Scottish king. The lords of Moray accepted Macbeth as their new king.

By all accounts, Macbeth enjoyed a very successful reign, which lasted 17 years. He promoted stability and sent patrols to the wilder areas of his kingdom to establish law and order. As evidence of the success he enjoyed as king, there were no uprisings while on pilgrimage to Rome 1050.

In 1054, English forces, led by Siward, Earl of Northumberland, at King Edward the Confessor's order, invaded Scotland. At the Battle of Dunisnane, Siward was defeated Macbeth, though he lost his own son in the battle. As a result of the battle, Macbeth lost Strathclyde. In 1057, Máel Coluim mac Donnchada (Malcolm, Duncan's son), raised an army, with English support, and invaded Scotland, reaching deep into Aberdeenshire. At the Battle of Lumphanan, on August 15, 1057, Macbeth was slain. He was buried on the holy isle of Iona. Macbeth was the last of the "Celtic" kings of Scotland.

Malcolm was crowned as Malcolm III. During his thirty-five year reign, the Scottish court and the Lowlands in general began to take more of an Anglo-Saxon and Norman influence.
